Growth in St Andrew's April 02 to May 03

Background

On Weds 30th May 2001 Fr David did not turn up to take the 10:30 Eucharist. Our Sacristan, Janet Hodge, went to the vicarage to investigate and found him stabbed. The chief suspect (a person unconnected with the Parish with a history of mental disturbance, who had evidently called at the Vicarage for help) subsequently committed suicide This shattering God has gathered us together to be a sign to our parish of his love for all. blow deprived us of a dear friend and of a wonderfully encouraging Christian leader, who inspired many, even those who met him very briefly. The *Mystery Worshipper* described St Andrews as "a remarkably friendly congregation": two practices that greatly helped was a Parish Breakfast after each Sunday Eucharist which was much more than tea and biscuits and fairly frequent shared meals and parties – where people would bring food and drink *to share*.

We realised that teamwork and collaboration, which Fr David had strongly encouraged, would be the key to growth (and indeed survival) as a Church. Two new Wardens (Christine Beale and Stella Boyce) had been appointed that May and took over the prime leadership responsibilities in June, ably assisted by their predecessors and by the PCC.

We realised we needed to concentrate on doing a few things well, and we focused on the Sunday Eucharist, with a Friday evening Mass and daily morning and evening prayer. Local priests, Bishops and the Archdeacon kindly officiated. We kept everyone informed by a weekly newsletter (examples follow), and regularly updated our posters (see miniatures attached) with a Special Guest Service about once a month. We encouraged people to fill in Welcome Cards and maintained them in a database which was used to generate mailings from time to time.


The PCC approved our Parish Profile in October seeking "A dynamic, empowering, inspiring and collaborative vicar who can help us serve the parish community and grow in numbers and holiness." It explained that "Great diversity is to be found amongst the population... The parish has a number of large council estates within its boundaries... redbrick mansion blocks ... are also part of the parish. Regular worshippers in our community are drawn from each of the examples given above". Eventually Fr Gavin joined us in Sept 02, to our great joy.

Roll at April 2002 APCM

On 21st April we had our ACPM, presided over by the Area Dean. The Electoral Roll Report for the meeting read thus: "Before the renewal of the Roll we had 110, up from a realistic 83 in May. 2 Roll members are known to have moved out of the Parish, and in the renewal of the Roll 26 new people have joined. Unfortunately not everyone on the old Roll has yet filled in their new Roll forms, so currently we only have 101 (hence there are 35 former roll members not on this roll)."

Growth to May 03

By the 24th June we were up to 114, and by the 19th Oct, 127. Of the 26 additions, 10 were on the old roll and 16 were not. By the 6th Dec another 6 had joined. By the 18th Apr 03, when we published the Draft Roll we were up to 138, and a further 5 people joined by the APCM. The graph shows roll numbers and the annualised rate of increase from 21st April.



Key Factors

I'd say the key factors in the growth were:

- **Faith**. We were convinced that God had called us to serve in this place, to proclaim the gospel of love, acceptance and worship. We believed that this did not depend entirely on having a Parish Priest in place, and *provided we knew that one would be arriving* we could continue the work by effective lay teamwork. Prayer and worship underpinned everything good that we did.
- **Hope**. We could see that new people were coming in on a weekly and monthly basis. We also had clear shared objectives for the development of the Church.
- Love. A wide and *diverse team of collaborative lay leadership* pulled together. 24 members of the leadership team were identified on a typical newsletter, and another 1-2 dozen were involved in various ministry teams. We actively sought out and welcomed new people, encouraging them to get involved and gently keeping in touch by the occasional mailing. We tried hard to keep people informed, with the weekly Newsletter, and to orient our church life to encouraging outsiders, and made it clear in everything we did that "you're always welcome at St Andrew's"

Before the renewal of the Roll we had 110, up from a realistic 83 in May. 2 Roll members are known to have moved out of the Parish, and in the renewal of the Roll 26 new people have joined. Unfortunately not everyone on the old Roll has yet filled in their new Roll forms, so currently we only have 101 (hence there are 35 former roll members not on this roll). We just wrote to 50 people who have not yet enrolled to encourage them, and hope to have responses from at least 24 of them, so by the end of May we should have 125, a 50% increase.
